

Coming to canolaPALOOZA on Tuesday, June 27 in Lacombe

COMING TO PALOOZA

The canolaPALOOZA site is at the south end of the Lacombe Research Station, on the south end of Lacombe where Highway 2A meets the C&E Trail [google map](#)

The site is open from 9:30am to 4:00pm

SANITATION GUIDELINES FOR VEHICLE PARKING AND PERSONAL ACCESS TO THE FIELD SITE

In order to mitigate the risk of spreading soil borne diseases in Alberta, the following procedures will be strictly enforced at canolaPALOOZA in Lacombe on June 27.

We strongly encourage everyone attending canolaPALOOZA to wash their vehicles before arriving at the canolaPALOOZA site

VEHICLE PARKING – Parking attendants will be on site.

Clean vehicles vehicles arriving clean will be checked to ensure there is no excessive mud present in the wheel wells or on the vehicle undercarriage. These vehicles will be granted permission to premium parking spaces inside the main canolaPALOOZA site in designated areas only.

Muddy vehicles (those with mud in the wheel wells or on the undercarriage) will be asked to angle park on a public roadway outside of the main canolaPALOOZA site. Please park close together to maximize spots.

PERSONAL ACCESS TO THE SITE

Everyone entering the canolaPALOOZA site will be required to clean their footwear on a disinfectant mat each time they enter the main site.

Booties will also be available for anyone that wants them.

ABOUT THE DAY

Upon arrival at the site, you will be asked to check in at the registration desk. We only have the names that were used during registration so please be patient if we need to add or correct names of the attendees.

There will be a map of the stations for you at the registration desk. canolaPALOOZA has many moving parts, so there could be changes to some instructors or planned learning stations.

This event is rain or shine – please prepare accordingly and dress appropriately for this outdoor event. Sunscreen and bug spray are always a good idea.

The event is very much a self-directed tour through the learning stations – you are free to visit the stations in any order and spend as much or as little time as you like.

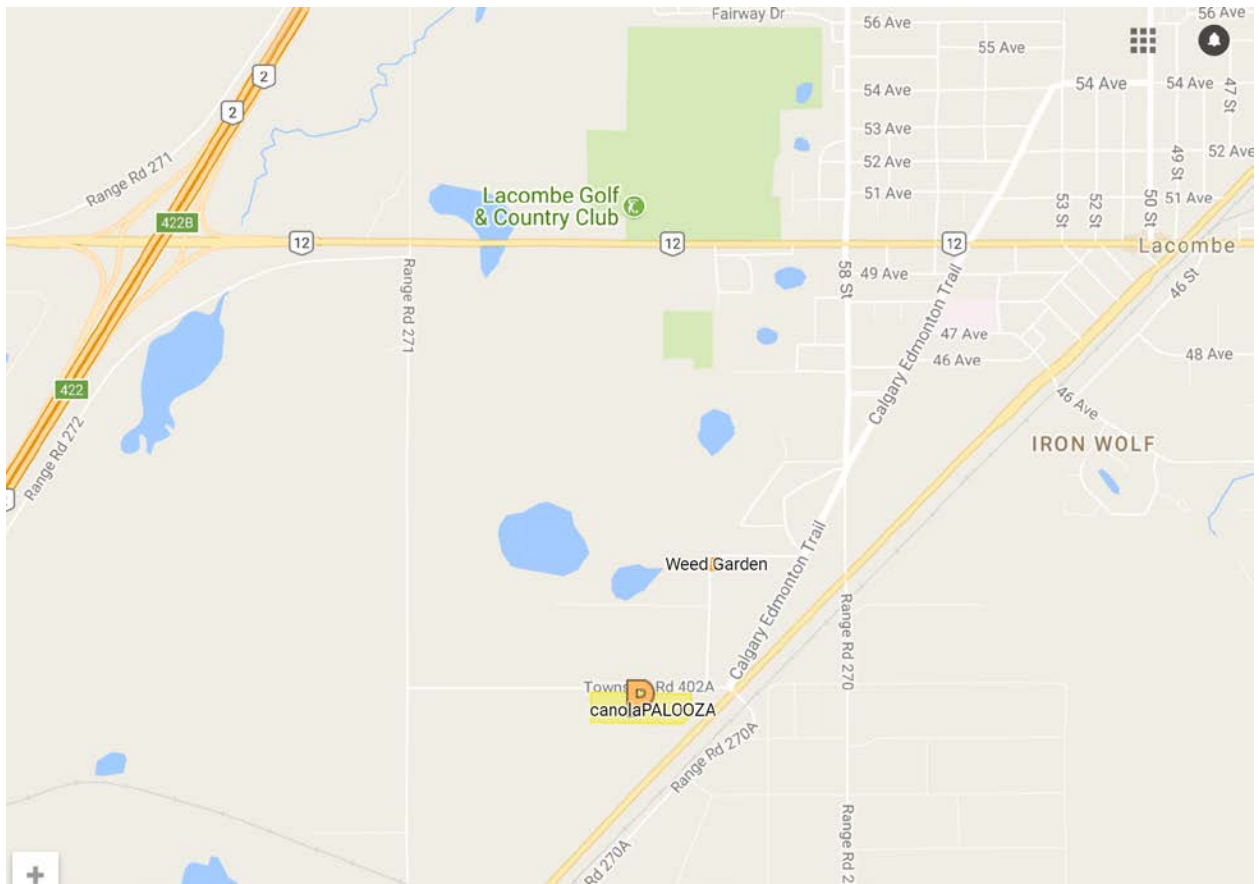
