Sanitation Guidelines for Vehicle Parking and Personal Access to the Field Site

- In order to mitigate the risk of spreading soil borne diseases, sanitation will be strictly enforced at canolaPALOOZA in Lacombe on June 26.
- We strongly encourage everyone attending canolaPALOOZA to **wash their vehicles before arriving** at the canolaPALOOZA site

VEHICLE PARKING – Parking attendants will be on site. We are expecting a very large crowd. Please respect the directions given by the attendants and do not waste valuable parking space.

PERSONAL ACCESS TO THE SITE

Everyone entering the canolaPALOOZA site will be required to clean their footwear on a disinfectant mat each time they enter and leave the main site. Booties will also be available for anyone that wants them.

Upon arrival at the site, you will be asked to check in at the registration desk. We only have the names that were used during registration so please be patient if we need to add or correct names of the attendees.
